Child Support services are offered through Minnesota counties. Either parent, with or without custody of their children, may receive these services. Families not receiving public assistance must apply for services by completing a Non Public Assistance application. You can obtain an application by calling our office. We will send one out to you if requested. Families receiving MFIP, medical assistance, and child care assistance automatically have an open child support case. Families must cooperate with child support efforts to continue receiving benefits. County child support offices use a variety of tools to set and collect support.

Child Support services include:

- Locating non-custodial parents
- Establishing parentage
- Establishing and enforcing child support orders which include medical support and child care support
- Collecting current and past due support
- Collections & Enforcement Tools
- Withholding child support from paychecks
- Intercepting Federal and State tax refunds to pay child support arrears
- Reporting those owing child support arrears to credit bureaus
- Suspending or revoking state issued recreational and occupational licenses for failure to pay child support
- Reviewing and adjusting child support orders periodically

- Bringing court actions for contempt against parents who are not paying their court ordered support
- Statewide child support enforcement system

MNsure is a marketplace where Minnesotans can shop, compare and choose health insurance coverage that meets their needs. MNsure is the only place where consumers can qualify for financial help either through federal tax credits or through MinnesotaCare and Medical Assistance.

If you qualify for a special enrollment period, you can enroll in a qualified health plan outside the annual open enrollment period. This includes those who lose coverage through their job-based insurance and want an alternative to COBRA continuation coverage.

If you qualify for Medical Assistance or MinnesotaCare, you can enroll year-round. You can get an idea of whether you qualify for one of these programs by reviewing the income level table on the website or creating an account and applying.

Free, in-person assistance is available for Minnesotans who have questions about MNsure or need help with enrollment. Certified navigators and brokers are available throughout the state.

So how does this all work?

**Step 1: Telephone Crisis Intervention and Triage**

- Contact the Carver County Crisis Program 24/7 by dialing 952-442-7601.
- A Crisis triage team member will complete an initial screening determining appropriate mental health care at the time of the call. Mobile response will be dispatched if needed.
- Telephone intervention techniques and consultation are available if a mobile response is not needed.

**Step 2: Mobile Crisis Assessment and Intervention**

- A mental health professional will meet with the individual in crisis in the community for an assessment. This may occur in any safe and appropriate location, including an individual's home.
- Along with the individual in crisis, the mental health professional will determine appropriate placement. This may include remaining in the home, residential crisis stabilization facilities or inpatient psychiatric hospitalization.
- A crisis treatment plan will be developed to address safety planning, problem-solving, conflict resolution, and rapid access to therapy and psychiatry.

**Step 3: Stabilization**

- After the crisis has resolved a mental health professional will provide short-term intensive intervention in the home to help restore the individual's level of functioning.
